Examples of some current research conducted by individuals affiliated with the Center include:

- Avian ecology and conservation in Peru and the Southern US
- Development of rapid diagnostic assays and vaccines for infectious diseases of birds
- Avian parasites and their impact on health
- Genome sequencing of endangered avian species
- Ecological investigations of avian migration and tick-borne disease risk
- Population genetics of Psittacines
- Enhancement of avian enrichment and captive breeding approaches
- Birds as bioindicators of health across Texas
- Clinical and surgical interventions

There is lots of awesome avian research taking place across campus, and we'd love to join together to enhance the TAMU avian research impact! Schubot members span multiple departments, including faculty, wildlife biologists, epidemiologists, veterinarians, ecologists, staff, and trainees in various levels (graduate students, undergraduates, veterinary trainees, postdocs).
